A Message from Our President

It is mid-January and Glen Lake is not yet frozen, except close to shore. However, there is no question this is winter as the snow is drifted four to five feet in places. It is a beautiful time here if you like winter conditions and many of you have understandably chosen warmer climates this time of year. But you will be back, so let me brief you on some of the issues and developments regarding the work of your Glen Lake Association.

We believe we have a good alternative to replace the SiCon program to control swimmers' itch. As you know, SiCon was our vendor for many years to trap and relocate Merganser ducks – a key to breaking the cycle that spreads the parasite. We purchased the boat from SiCon used for this purpose and have contracted with a biologist at the Leelanau School to run the program. More on this in Rob Karner's article included later.

I indicated in our last newsletter that we had asked the Leelanau Road Commission to request a review by the State Police of the speed limits on the eastern side of Big Glen and Day Forest Road. We have now learned that the study will be done, thanks in part to support from the three townships involved. The timing of the study is unclear, but we believe it will be this summer or before.

Karner's Korner

News from Our Watershed Biologist

Top Priorities for 2010

In planning for 2010, I am reminded of the two main goals of the Glen Lake Association. The first is to preserve the natural beauty of our watershed, and second is to protect the water quality. Both goals are similar and strategies employed often function together.

The water quality committee has been working hard to finalize our greenbelt survey. Soon, you will hear more about the results of this survey but one thing that comes as no surprise; each and every riparian has an impact on the beauty and water quality of our watershed. No one person or organization can achieve the goals of GLA – each riparian must do their part and collectively, we can and will meet our goals.

By the annual meeting in August, you will have a complete report of the greenbelt survey and each riparian will have access to their “score”. Those riparians with high scores will be encouraged to maintain their course of action or inaction. Riparians with average scores will be encouraged to improve their score with some suggestions for adding to or better maintaining their greenbelt. Riparians with low scores will be encouraged to create (with help from GLA) and implement a greenbelt plan and thereby, make progress towards adding to the natural beauty and protecting the water quality.

Controlling swimmer's itch continues to be a top priority for GLA. We have made significant progress in the last six years in reducing swimmer's itch and now it is time for GLA to continue the program by taking on full responsibility for all the activities of the program. We hope to hire representatives of former SiCon, Inc. for consultation and training. Also, GLA has hired Joe Blondia, MS., to take the lead role in controlling swimmer's itch. GLA has secured it's own watercraft which is needed for

removing common mergansers from our lake. State and Federal permit applications are pending and we should know by early spring if permits are granted to GLA.

Remember – please do not harass mergansers during late May, June, and early July – this action will make it nearly impossible to live trap and relocate merganser broods off the lake.



Finally, three new videos have been produced which emphasize good water quality management practices near lakeshores. I hope you will look for these links on the GLA website and watch them. As you consider the advice and tips for water quality, we encourage you to take action steps to help us achieve our goals.

As I make my way around the lake doing water quality monitoring, please don't hesitate to flag me down and have a chat about what's going on with the water quality committee work.

What Is a “Watershed” Anyway?

As Goes the quality of Glen Lake/Crystal River Watershed...

...So Goes Glen Lake.

Everyone lives in a watershed. Do you know what a watershed is, how watershed boundaries are established, what watershed you live in, and most importantly why understanding the watershed concept is so important?

It's likely most of our Alligator & Inspiration readers either live or own property within the Glen Lake-Crystal River Watershed, and understanding the watershed concept and its importance is vital.

At the boundary (highest elevation) of a watershed, on one side, surface water flows downhill into a given watershed, and on the other side flows into another watershed. Topology is a main factor that determines flow direction and governmental regulatory agencies make these determinations and define the boundaries. There are major and sub-watersheds defined. For instance, on a large scale, the great lakes are within the Great Lakes Watershed. The Glen Lake-Crystal River Watershed is a sub-watershed and the waters that flow downhill from the surrounding hilltops flow into Glen Lake, Fisher Lake, Brooks Lake and finally the Crystal River.

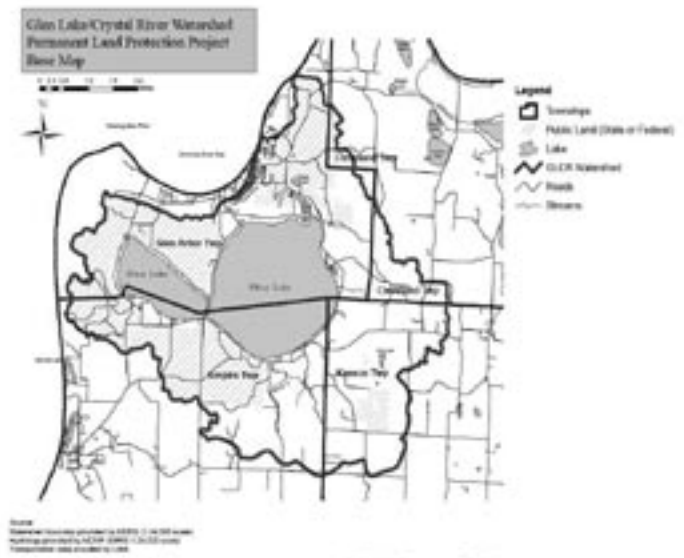
A watershed comprises the complete system of surface water and groundwater (below ground water), taking in the entire drainage basin for a particular watercourse. Watersheds are shaped by gravity, terrain, and the movement of water. Since water is so critical to life, watersheds provide the sustenance of human communities and define cultures.

As the rain water begins its travel downhill from the top of our watershed, it can take several paths. It can be absorbed by the soil, be taken up by trees and other vegetation (which use the nutrients that are collected and carried by the water), it can feed small streams such as Hatlem Creek, or depending upon how permeable the ground, either flow underground or directly into our lakes. Impervious surfaces such as paved roads or driveways, and roofs of building structures do not allow absorption. Lawn turf which has a relatively shallow root system also allows heavy

rains to reach our lake waters unabsorbed. Little nutrient take-up occurs with these turf lawns as well. Thus nutrients, whether lawn fertilizer or animal droppings, and toxic chemicals, for instance road and driveway contaminants, can be carried directly into our lakes. Riparian greenbelts or buffer strips along the water's edge are a great line of defense by their ability to absorb these undesirable substances and help keep them out of our waters. Watersheds also define communities. As Glen Lake connects us to places as far flung as the ocean, or as close as our area neighbors, it joins us all in a special way. Caring for the watershed is a community responsibility – the actions of every landowner (especially riparians, lakeside or streamside) impacts the quality of every riparian's water. As goes the quality of Glen Lake's watershed – so goes Glen Lake. And it befalls every individual to use their precious watershed responsibly to protect the lifeblood of our community.

The Glen Lake-Crystal River Watershed boundaries are shown on the below map extracted from our Glen Lake-Crystal River Watershed Management Plan approved by the MDEQ and the EPA last fall. When driving to our area note the watershed signs that mark the approximate boundaries of our watershed.

The plan revision, enhanced to meet the EPA's 9 required elements and the Clean Michigan Initiative criteria, allows GLA to apply for a variety of Federal and State grants and

Gerry felt it was time to let someone else “enjoy” these rigors, so Bruce Lichliter has graciously stepped into his shoes by assuming this responsibility.

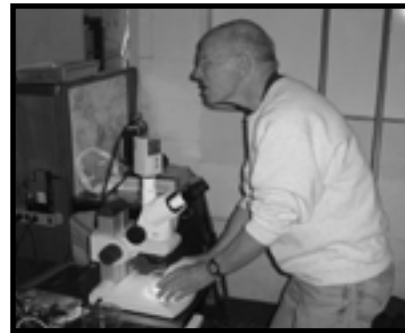

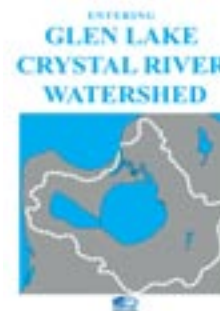

Stewardship Checklist

Getting To Know Your Watershed (from your Glen Lake-Crystal River Stewardship Checklist, pp.3)

- Locate your house on the watershed map. (Handbook, page 28-29)
- Familiarize yourself with the watershed boundary nearest your home. Think about walking to the highest point of our watershed nearest you.
- Imagine that everyone else has walked to the highest point of our watershed nearest them. Now we all join hands. We have outlined our watershed!
- Imagine that someone is building a house in our watershed. Think about what is going to impact the watershed from this house.
- Imagine that you are raindrops or snow, traveling as run-off or groundwater to Glen Lake, the Crystal River, and other bodies of water in the watershed.
- Imagine you see erosion or contamination of the land or in water running down the hill that may be affecting the water quality of Glen Lake and/or the Crystal River.
- Walk to the top of the watershed somewhere along its boundary and instead of “imagining” actually take a walk down the hillside from a high point in our watershed.
- Look for impervious surfaces on you walk. Imagine what will happen to the water when it hits these surfaces.
- On your walk compare the number of areas that have trees, shrubs, and other vegetation to absorb water travelling down our watershed with those areas that have impervious surfaces.
